Message from Chancellor



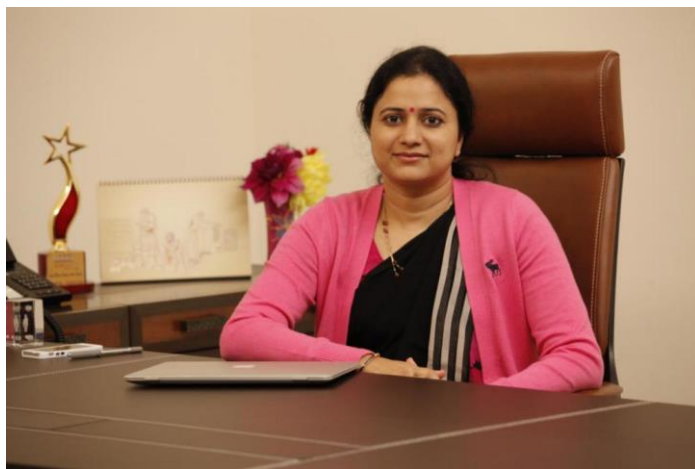

The Examination department functions under the aegis of the Controller of Examination who reports to the Vice Chancellor.

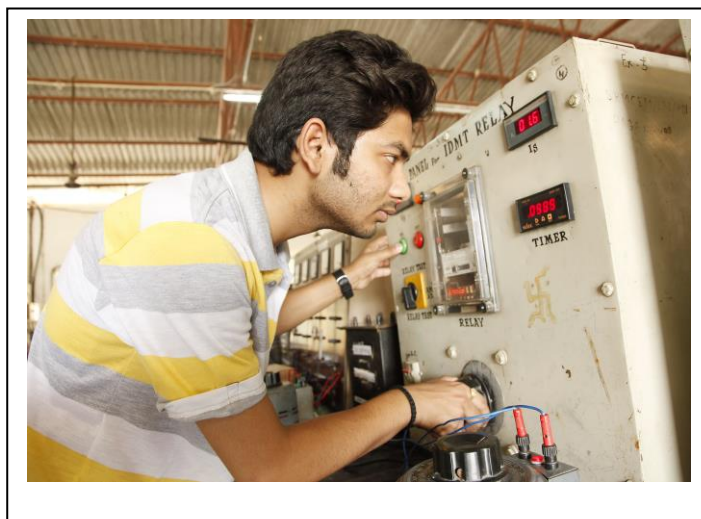

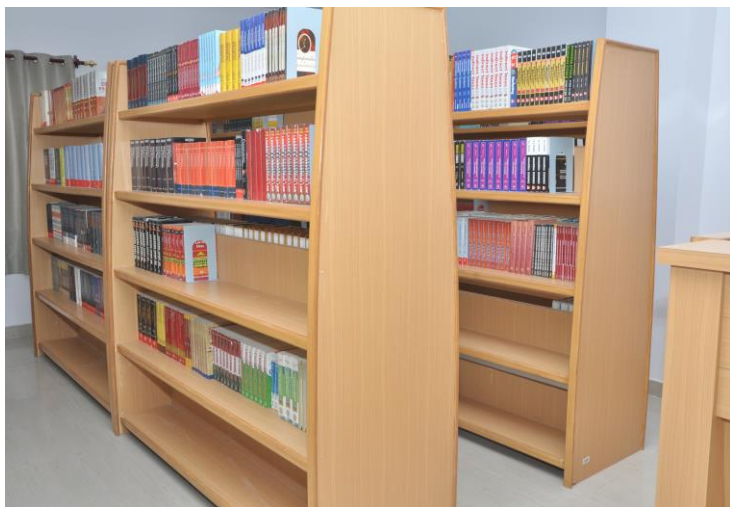

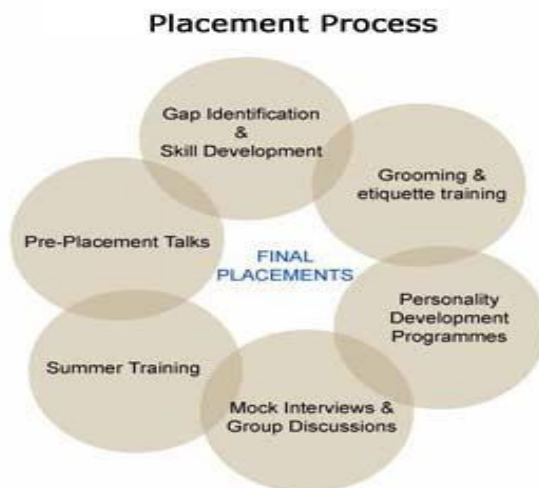
