Message from Chancellor



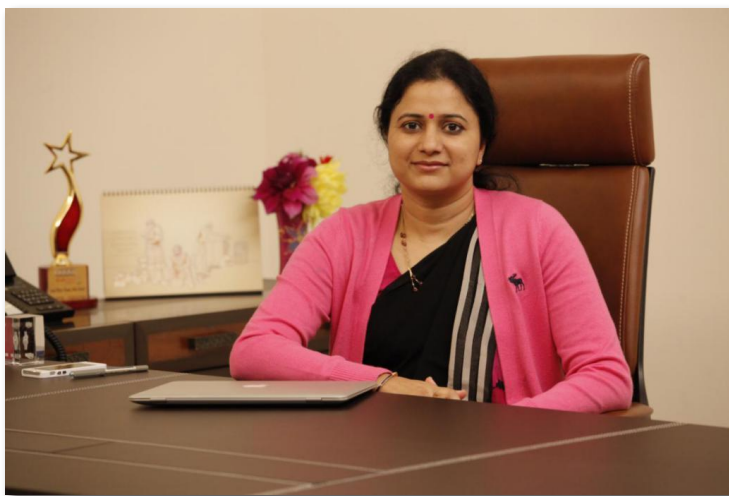

Message from Pro-Chancellor



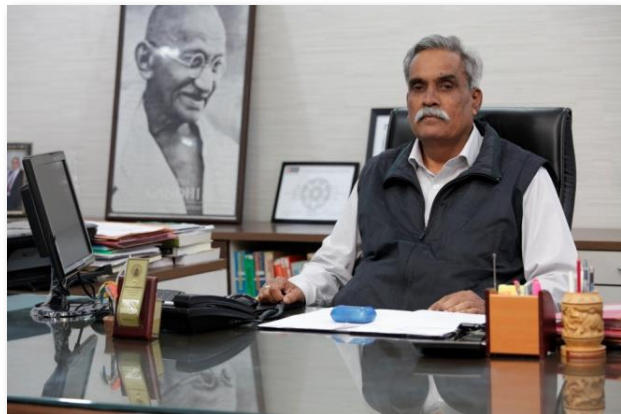
